DIGGING DEEPER

1. This weekend we heard Scott tell us that for a Contender, there's a time to pray and a time to get off of our knees and do something. How then, can we know what we ought to be doing at any given time?

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:17. Why would God consider prayer important enough to tell us to "never stop praying?"

What does it mean to live in continual prayer, and how can we actually do that?

2. Read Romans 8:14. What does it mean to be "led by God?"

Can you recall a time in your life when you felt that God was leading you? What were the circumstances and how did it play out?

3. Read James 1:22-25. It's been said that these verses in James are among the most critical for Christian living. What keeps you from actually putting God's word into action?

Make a list of the top five things we already know God has given us the "green light" on. How can we be sure we have a "green light?"

4. Scott stated that we all have gifts and that we should be using them for the "Kingdom." Read Romans 12:6-8. How has God gifted you and how can your gifts be used in the Kingdom? (What seems to come natural for you?)
5. Many times people tend to think that because they are not in professional ministry that they can't be as effective for the kingdom as others, or think they not as gifted as someone else. Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-26. What is Paul telling us about how the gifts (our abilities) play out in the church?
6. At the end of our lives the only things that are going to be eternal are the things we do for God and the things we do for others. How can you leverage your gifts beginning this week that will have an eternal impact?
